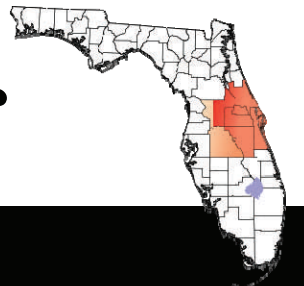

Relapse Lurks by Carolyn O. (Orlando)

I'm working my program— to its fullest. It's really simple, just do what's suggested. Work with a sponsor. Reach out to another alcoholic. It's all there...written in the Big Book and the literature. Meetings are the highlights of my week. So, what's new with that, you might ask?

Well, it's new again for me. I'm one of the those old-timers that the book speaks about. I had become complacent with sponsorship, with the steps, with meetings. I had all this time behind me and let other things get in the way of my focus on sobriety. Relapse Lurked. It hid behind the mask of time.

One of the oldest sayings in AA is, "The further away you are from a drink, the closer you are to your next one."

All was well as far as I was concerned for many years. Life became fairly routine. There were no tragedies or major problems. The fact that I found other interests led me to believe that it was okay to see the train coming and wave it on instead of getting out of the way.


I remember feeling "Is this all there is?" Maybe I was expecting too much. Boredom and apathy set in. I had no purpose— fertile soil for resentments and character defects to grow like weeds. I wasn't able to recognize them. I wasn't

doing a daily inventory and I wasn't talking to anyone about my feelings.

The Big Book says we pay a dear price for doing this. Even if we're lucky enough to not pick up a drink, our lives are stunted by our isolation and lack of participation in life.

By the grace of GOD, someone saw the path I was walking down and took the time to say "get back on the bus." I did not relapse, but I was very close...it was knocking at my door.

I guess I am trying to say that none of us are immune to relapse, so we need to be ever vigilant about our recovery, never taking sobriety for granted.

So when they say the newcomer is the most important person in the room, they are because they keep it green for the rest of us. They ask the dumb questions, which are not actually dumb at all when you think about it.
