I feel we A.A.'s will be experiencing a reawakening of recovery, unity and service in the Central Florida area. It is my hope that many will have a reawakening of the spirit of service. Service will continue to be an essential in my recovery. Please consider service being an essential for your personal recovery too.

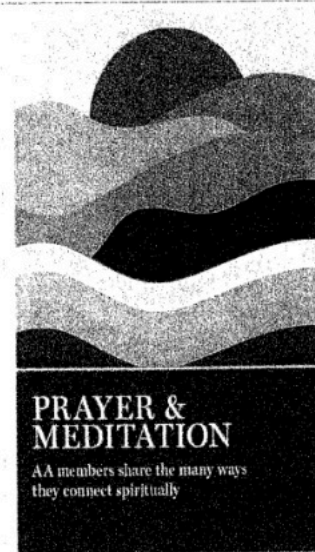

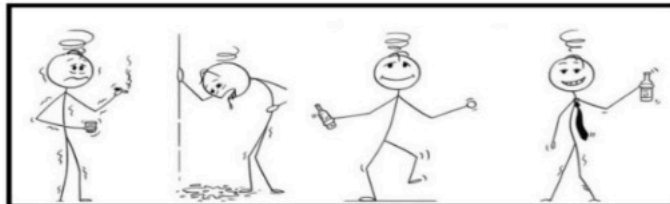

The Twelve Concepts for World Service provide a group of related principles to help ensure that various elements of A.A.'s service structure remain responsive and responsible to those they serve. **Step Five:** "Admitted to God, to ourselves and to another human being the exact nature of our wrongs." **Tradition Five:** "Each group has but one primary purpose to carry its message to the alcoholic who still suffers." **Concept Five:** "Throughout our world service structure, a traditional Right of Appeal ought to prevail, thus assuring us that minority opinion will be heard and that petitions for the redress of personal grievances will be carefully considered."
