





AA's Twelve Steps are principles for personal recovery. The Twelve Traditions ensure the unity of the Fellowship. The Twelve Concepts for World Service provide a group of related principles to help ensure that various elements of AA's service structure remain responsive and responsible to those they serve. **Step Eight:** "Made a list of all persons we had harmed, and became willing to make amends to them all." **Tradition Eight:** "Alcoholics Anonymous should remain forever nonprofessional, but our service centers may employ special workers." **Concept Eight:** "The trustees of the General Service Board act in two primary capacities: (a) With respect to the larger matters of overall policy and finance, they and their primary committee directly manage these affairs. (b) But with respect to our separately incorporated and constantly active services, the relation of the trustees is mainly that of full stock ownership and of custodial oversight which they exercise through their ability to elect all directors of these entities."

My name is Lou and my sponsor, Vic L. is celebrating 40 years of sobriety this month. I wanted to do something special and recognize Vic for all his service in AA over the last 40 years. I thought it would honor him if I wrote the story of how we met and how that meeting helped change the course of my life.

Vic and my dad were members of the same church. My dad was trying to find a way to help me get sober and because Vic wasn't shy about his past, my dad was able to ask Vic if there was anything he could do to help me. Vic offered to do a 12 step call to my house. He showed up at my door one afternoon holding a book. I thought he was a bible salesman or something. He talked about his past. He said he found a solution in AA and there was a way out. He left me a Big Book that day and I don't think I ever opened it. I wasn't ready yet, but the seed was planted.

A few months later I was back in jail again. I remembered Vic telling me he knew a way out, so I signed up for the AA meeting. I went to my first AA meeting in the Seminole County Jail. A couple of years later I was sitting in the Happy Hour Group and Vic was chairing the meeting. After the meeting was over, I went up to Vic and introduced myself. After being sober for two years, I had changed so much that he didn't even recognize me. We talked for a few minutes, and he invited me to have breakfast with the guys on Saturday morning. He's been my sponsor ever since.

I didn't realize at the time, but the talk we had at my house would be the first of hundreds of lectures, I mean talks, we would have over the years. Vic has a way of drilling things into my head, and I've learned so much from him over the years, but the thing I've learned most is service. He sets a great example for me. He always has something going on, a workshop or book study, and he loves teaching history and traditions. He's been saying he's going to slow down for a few years now, but someone will ask for his help and he is always willing. He just keeps going.



I'm very proud of Vic. He's been so many things to me, a mentor, sponsor and friend. He is someone I can really look up to.
