A Service Opportunity in Alcoholics Anonymous

What is Bridging the Gap (BTG)?

Bridging the Gap connects Alcoholics Anonymous (A.A.) members with individuals who are completing treatment or leaving correctional or healthcare settings and need help finding meetings in their home community. Temporary contacts meet these new or returning members and accompany them to their first few A.A. meetings—helping “bridge the gap” between a facility and local A.A.

Why It Matters

Many people in treatment or transitional programs want to continue their recovery in A.A. but may not know where to start. Having a friendly A.A. member meet them, answer questions, and attend a meeting together often makes the difference between isolation and connection.

How You Can Help

- Volunteer to be a temporary contact (matched by gender and, when possible, age).
- Share BTG information at your group, district, or Intergroup.
- Encourage treatment and transitional facilities to reach out for collaboration.

BTG is a short-term service commitment—just enough to help newcomers find their footing and begin their A.A. journey.

AA’s Twelve Steps are principles for personal recovery. The Twelve Traditions ensure the unity of the Fellowship. The Twelve Concepts for World Service provide a group of related principles to help ensure that various elements of AA’s service structure remain responsive and responsible to those they serve .

Step One: We admitted we were powerless over our addiction - that our lives had become unmanageable

Tradition One: Our common welfare should come first; personal recovery depends upon AA unity.

Concept One: Final responsibility and ultimate authority for A.A. world services should always reside in the collective conscience of our whole Fellowship.
