Central Florida Intergroup Services, Inc.

A Central Office or Intergroup is an A.A. service office that involves partnership among groups in a community — just as A.A. groups themselves are partnerships of individuals. A central office/intergroup is established to carry out certain functions common to all the groups — functions that are best handled by a centralized office — and it is usually maintained, supervised and supported by these groups in their general interest. It exists to aid the groups in their common purpose of carrying the A.A. message to the alcoholic who still suffers. - From "What are Central Offices or Intergroups?" aa.org

Central Florida Intergroup Services, Inc. shall be guided by and adhere to the Twelve Concepts, Twelve Traditions and the Twelve Steps of Alcoholics Anonymous.

Some of our services are as follows:

1. Respond to phone or walk-in requests for help from alcoholics.
2. Maintain current listings of A.A. meetings and groups with meetings on an internet website, www.cfintergroup.org that the A.A. Meeting Guide APP updates from. We also maintain a print version. The meetings may be in-person, virtual or hybrid. The office handles phone and mail inquiries, and routes them to local groups, thus distributing 12th step work on a geographical basis so that newcomers are assured of help.
3. Provide a 24 Hour Helpline: 407-260-5408.
4. Stock and sell A.A. and Grapevine literature.
5. Serve as a communication center for participating groups, publishing a monthly newsletter, *the Intergrouper* to keep groups and members informed about one another.
6. Cooperate with local, district and area committees. Elect members to serve as liaisons and welcome their participation in INTERGROUP meetings.
7. Maintain communication and cooperation — but not affiliation — with the community and helping professionals in the field of alcoholism.

Three Legacies

AA's Twelve Steps are principles for personal recovery. The Twelve Traditions ensure the unity of the fellowship. The Twelve Concepts for World Service provide a group of related principles to help ensure the various elements of A.A.'s service structure remain responsive and responsible to those they serve.

Step Three: "Made a decision to turn our will and our lives to the care of God as we understood Him."

Tradition Three: "The only requirement for A.A. membership is a desire to stop drinking."

Concept Three: "To insure effective leadership, we should endow each element of A.A. — the Conference, the General Service Board and its service corporations, staffs, committees, and executives — with a traditional "Right of Decision."
